



Calling all young artists! Want to take part in our Clean Air Day poster competition?

Clean Air Day (June 21st) is all about encouraging people to make small changes to their lives that will make a **big** difference for the quality of the air we breathe. Pollution in London is high and it can make us very sick.

So we want all our Islington Primary School students to create a **brilliant poster** to let people know what they can do to reduce the amount of pollution they make and make our air cleaner and safer for everyone.

The competition will be judged in two age groups – KS1 and KS2. The winning entries and two runners up will have their posters displayed in Islington Museum and Central Library from 21st June – 27th, for everyone to see! The best poster from each school will also be on display at Islington Museum. Plus, the two winning entries will be made into postcards and made available, for free, in our libraries.

Your design should encourage people to:

- Walk, scoot or cycle instead of taking the car
- Turn off the car engine when they're not moving. Leaving your engine running is called idling.
- Car share – so there are less cars on the road
- Use public transport

Use clear messages and **bold clear colours and design** (felt tips preferably) to make it easier for people to read and understand your message.

Use a blank sheet of A4 paper to do your poster design. Use the whole sheet and work right up to the edges of the paper.

Remember to include your name, age and school in pencil on the back of your poster so we can find you if you're the winner!
